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


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### On The Cover

Starting on page 6, read excerpts from the application materials of these very deserving students.

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




### **Triple Threat Holidays!!**

The Vikings have been awesome this season with their triple threat of Brett Farvre, Adrian Peterson and Jared Allen.

We also have a triple threat for the holiday sales season Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years. What do we know about this 2009 holiday season? We know that sales have been okay with economic situation but not great, people are buying down a bit and want more for their dollar. How can we use that information during this holiday season?

Well no matter what people do spend money during any holiday season. So I encourage you all to look at the basics of our business first and foremost.

### Let's not forget the things that should be done at all times:

- Clean, bright, presentable facilities.
- Always friendly greetings when a customer enters your store.
- Facing bottles constantly and keeping displays full and priced.
- Staff should always be friendly (even though busy) and always remember customer service is #1!

### <u>Some additional things to do during this triple threat season:</u>

- Display gift packages, whether prepackaged by the supplier or you create your own. Be creative!
- Display and promote upscale products, if they really want that \$3 or \$4 dollar bottle they will find it.
- Make sure staff is knowledgeable of holiday products and promotions.

- Impulse buys, make sure you have high margin items at the counter for the last minute.
- Build more margin in low end items so if after you have presented all the higher end options and they still buy down your margin is protected.

The reason I call this a triple threat is a third of my sales for the 4th quarter are done in 3 weeks Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years. Look for 25% to 35% increases for those triple threat weeks.

One complaint I have heard is about staffing for these busy periods. We want to make sure our employees are happy and can spend quality time with their families during the holidays. However in the retail world we live in, we must staff our stores and also take care of our customers with adequately staffed facilities. One thing we in Brooklyn Center do is during the interview process we question about working the holidays. This gives the person the right thought process about staffing during busy times. Also as managers we need to act as leaders and be out with our staff helping during these busy times.

### SPSH?

How do you staff for busy days? Look at a formula called SPSH (sales per staffing hour). Divide your sales by your staffing hours for the day. If you typically have a \$5000 sales day and you staff 18 hours of labor for it you have at SPSH of \$277.78. Now look at what kind of sales you expect to do those busy days and try to follow the same SPSH formula you usually have. Last Saturday at 1 store we ran \$427.78 SPSH and our other store which is a little slower we ran \$306.64 SPSH. Whatever number you come up with as your plan is just that "It's your plan". Have a set plan and start tracking it over the years you will be surprised how it will help in the planning process for staffing.

Well have a wonderful selling season, and give your customers an experience that they will not soon forget and tell all their friends about.


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# 2009 MMBA Scholarship Winners!




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Amber Johnson

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




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Sierra Koethe

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
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Zach Lunder


